
Dear Friends,

Due to the ongoing fallout from the Royal Commission into Institutional Sexual Abuse we, the Pallottines, find ourselves confronted with the need to continue to liquidate Assets. This means the sale of our house at 85 Studley Park Road. This will not come as a surprise to many of you.

Although we have a long history at Kew (more than 90 years) and many of our Confreres and members of the wider Pallottine Community have a great lived experience and history at Kew, we have had to bow to the inevitable. We are now in the final stages of gaining the required permissions from Church Authorities and we anticipate the sale to happen before Christmas.

We intend to have a farewell Celebrations prior to the new owners taking over. As the details are finalised, we will advertise this on our website pallottine.org.au. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support of us over the years and pray that you will continue to support us in the future.

In this magazine, we share news, views and reflections of the way the UAC (Union of Catholic Apostolate) lives the vision of St. Vincent Pallotti here in Australia.

New leaders elected for UAC

The retiring world leader of the Pallottine Fathers and Brothers, Fr Jacob Nampudakam, is the new President of the Union of the Catholic Apostolate, the official name of the Pallottine Family.

Fr Jacob, from India, succeeds Ms Donatella Acerbi, whose term had expired. Donatella's sister, Ms Gabriella Acerbi — a retired senior executive with the municipality of Rome — was elected Vice-President of the UAC, succeeding Brazilian Pallottine Fr Gilberto Orsolin.

The elections were held at the first annual meeting of the new UAC General Coordination Council in Rome, which was elected in March, from 16-19 June. They cover the term from 2022-25.

Thirteen people are members of the GCC — the leaders of the Pallottine priests and brothers and of the two congregations of Pallottine sisters plus 10 other members, including married and single laypeople, from places as diverse as Australia, Brazil, Cameroon, India, Poland and the US.

Mark Brolly is the third Australian to serve on the GCC, following many years of service by Cheryl Sullivan of Melbourne and Tricia Wisolith of Perth.

A message from the GCC published after its meeting said that apart from the elections, “we gave ourselves ample opportunity to get to know

each other, particularly because many were participating for the first time”.

“Always guided by prayer, in the light of the Holy Spirit, we identified challenges, which are never lacking in this service of animation; however, enlightened by faith and the desire to build together we will also be able to face even such obstacles.

“The proposals and decisions made in the last UAC General Assembly (in March this year) were considered with great care. Together with other things that emerged during the meeting, this material allowed us to establish guidelines for action and animation, and to plan concrete activities, for the whole Union, involving the different realities of the Pallottine Family. However, they will bear good fruit only through a broader synodal process in the Union at every level.”

Mass at the tomb of St Vincent Pallotti in the church of San Salvatore in Onda marked a moving end of the meeting.

The next annual face-to-face meeting of the GCC will be held from 24-29 March 2023, again in Rome.

“Everyone has a story. . .”

Everyone has a story with a history of ups and downs, adversities, challenges, accomplishments, celebrations and everything in between which adds to the diverse nature of their personality.


Personally, I feel I had a rich childhood and upbringing in terms of traditional celebrations, family values, Catholic morals, good education and what you would consider the average modern day Australian childhood.

I had hardships along the way with bullying in school, my father walking out on the family before my mother gave birth to me and then divorcing. I had a beautiful rich relationship break up in 2010 and plummeted myself of sense, confidence,

and tarnish my dreams. I went through a phase of questioning life, purpose, identity, Catholicism and although I always hold on to hope and communicate with God personally, I found myself seeking purpose.

With a strong desire to be a mother I fell into a very toxic what I prefer to call a ‘situationship’ in 2013 and this very nearly destroyed my life but in a twisted way also provided my greatest blessing. 2013-2016 were years that stripped me of my voice, personality, confidence, reputation, friendships, family contact, I lost jobs, had to give up the house I was building, fell into financial hardships and was being repeatedly beaten during a pregnancy I didn’t expect to happen. I had always vowed to wait for marriage. I clung to God silently and internalised my conversations and prayers, pleading with him daily to keep myself and my child safe from harm, I had faith He was listening, and we would get through this part of the journey.

I had a beautiful baby girl, who is my whole world, best friend, daughter and all-time greatest blessing. Through a couple of years of health issues and further turmoil we finally managed to find our way out, I always protected my daughter but when she turned to her I was out!



And so began the road of recovery and rebuilding our lives. To this day I am still rebuilding, it feels like it won’t leave us sometimes and constantly dragging us down with stigma and the scars both physical and emotional for myself, but I know through my faith and supports and the steps I’ve taken so far and strength I’ve gained it and anything is possible.

I heard about the Clinical Pastoral Education course from a friend who had studied it themselves and they thought I was ready for this knowing I was a nurse my profession and passionate about my faith and helping others with a natural charismatic and empathetic nature. I wasn’t sure if I was ready emotionally so I discerned it for a short time and then thought I would see how I go however there was no way I would be able to afford it financially being thousands of dollars it

seemed impossible, I was barely able to afford food, had PTSD so wasn't able to work outside of school hours as I didn't trust anyone with my daughter for fear the ex would find and harm us.

I was recommended to contact the Pallottines and apply for the St Vincent Pallotti scholarship. I am forever grateful that I followed through and applied and eternally thankful for receiving the very generous scholarship. I can easily say completing the Clinical Pastoral Education course has completely changed my life, it renewed my confidence, I found my voice again, I formed life-long friendships, my clinical confidence was restored, I was reminded of my purpose. I threw myself completely into the program without walls and I dug deep, really deep, the conversations were incredible, there was laughter, tears, shame, growth, rollercoaster of emotions but constant support and direction to strengthen ourselves from within. It is truly a phenomenal course and will forever have a

place in my heart and memory. Without this I'm not sure where I would be today on my journey.

Finding my voice was everything! I can now share this skill with those who need someone to listen and truly empathise with them and just HEAR and BE with them without judgement and agenda. I graduated in 2021 in the middle of the Perth peaks of Covid. I have regular catch ups with my fellow group members and consider them like sisters.

I am so very thankful to the Pallottines for giving me this incredible and transformative experience and life changing opportunity with the St Vincent Pallotti Scholarship. I hope and pray they get continued support so they're able to offer others this opportunity and spread the work and actions of Jesus further across our beautiful communities and impact the lives of others.

Ron Charles RIP

Ron, originally from Williamstown, Victoria, was a hard-working Lay Missionary at La Grange for about 7 years from 1969. He drove the truck from the Mission to the Broome wharf each week for the supplies. He looked after the Big Boys and the Little Boys and gave opportunities to some of the Bidyadanga boys to travel and experience life beyond La Grange, which in those days was a rare thing.

Ron also spent time in America and Peru, working with people in need. Over those years he made and maintained some very strong relationships.

When Ron returned to Melbourne, he became a foster parent to 40+ boys over a period of 15 years, whether that was for a few days or a longer period. Mark, who lived with Ron, and Cody, who also spent years with Ron in recent times, gave testament to him being a very generous, gentle, and caring figure in their lives who handed on some very handy life skills to them. They, along with Daniel and Kelly who also share Ron's home,

cared for Ron in recent times so he could be at home as long as possible. These 4 young people were just amazing and were privileged to be with Ron at his death.

Ron's wonderful lifelong friend Ila Saunders from Tasmania also did a Eulogy giving a broad picture of Ron's life. Ila cared for Ron's needs over the last couple of years directing him through the Hospitals and Nursing Home systems and events up until his death on the 16th June.

A special time for Ron in recent years was spending Christmas day with Fr. Kevin McKelson's nieces Mary and Louise and their families. The attached photo is from the last occasion. Farewell Ron! Well done!
